

# FEAST FOR YOUR FOUR-LEGGED FRIEND

## Step 1

Get yourself some oat grass seeds – available at garden shops, Bunnings and pet shops.

## Step 2

Next you need a container to grow it in – a pet bowl, empty yoghurt container or a garden pot. Make sure you poke some holes in the base, you may need an adult to help you. You can decorate your container, put the name of your pet on it – with paint or permanent marker.

## Step 3

Fill the container almost to the top with potting mix, and moisten it. Let the water soak in before you plant your seeds. Sprinkle your oat grass seeds into the pot, and push them down below the surface. Make sure they are lightly covered by the potting mix.

## Step 4

Water the seeds – not a lot, just make sure the potting mix is moist. Loosely cover the pot with plastic wrap – this traps the moisture and helps the seeds to germinate. Keep the pot somewhere warm – maybe on top of the fridge or on a window sill.



## Step 5

Check each day, add enough water to keep the potting mix moist. On day 3 remove the plastic wrap.

## Step 6

On day 4 put the pot in a sunny spot and show your cats the emerging grass... by day 7 they can start to eat their grass!

## Step 7

Don't have a cat? Don't worry – dogs and rabbits can enjoy this too!
